Course Description: This course draws on pre-service teachers' practica in order to address a range of professional issues including educational law, professional roles, duties and responsibilities of teachers, ethics, professional relationships and communities of inquiry, the role of teachers' unions and associations, school based technology, and school/community partnerships including school transitions and communication with parent/guardians and the hiring process including resume writing, interview preparation and the job search.

Qualifications: Master's in education or higher in an area relevant to the advertised course. A record of academic expertise in relevant theories related to the creation of a positive and successful professional teacher identity is required. Recent experience as an educational leader at a Regional Office or as a school-based administrator is required. Relevant knowledge and experience of educational leadership in areas of policy, ethics, unions, school-community partnerships, teaching standards, career planning, and curriculum development is required. Recent experience designing, delivering, and assessing a teacher education course at a university level is preferred. Successful recent experience working independently and as part of a team is essential. The B.Ed. is a provincially accredited program. Applicants will therefore be expected to teach to the accreditation standards for this course.
